2023 Community Appreciation Award



The Comber Agricultural Society would like to recognize the many contributions made to our community by Mark and Linda McKinlay. Although they always worked outside the home, they have enjoyed many experiences volunteering with various local organizations. As the parents of four children, they were often drawn to working with youth. Between the two of them, they participated in the Comber IODE, the Comber Fire Department, Brownies, Boy Scouts, Softball Coaches, the PTA at Centennial School, and their Church, St Andrews United Church. During this time, Linda held public office as a Councillor for Tilbury West, and until recently, the Municipality of Lakeshore. She was also on the Board of Directors for the Lower Thames Valley Conser-

vation Authority serving several years as Chairman. Mark has spent many years on the Comber and District Historical Society Board with 10 years as President. In recent years, both Mark and Linda have been recognized for their contributions and commitment to their community, both receiving the "Senior of the Year" award from The Good Neighbour Club in Belle River and Area, and Mark was honoured to receive the Community Heritage Medal from the Department of History at the University of Windsor for his work with the Comber Museum.

Like many families in the Comber area, the McKinlay's have always considered the Fair to be the high-light of the summer. They have spent 25 years working together on the Board of the Comber Agricultural Society, contributing to many different committees. Linda doesn't even remember how they joined, but once they did, it was something they looked forward to each year. Mark spent many years working the grounds, assisting the treasurer, managing the money at the gates, judging various events and all the while – taking hundreds of pictures for the Fair board. Meanwhile, Linda spent most of her time organizing the entertainment - hosting events on stage, booking musical acts for the evening shows, or judging the talent contest - even representing the Comber Fair as a judge at the "Rise 2 Fame Youth Talent Search" at the Western Fair. Together, this couple spent many years booking the exhibitor and vendor booths, and at one point, had 40 booths set up. As the years passed, they had the opportunity to make this a family tradition, with their now-grown children involved in volunteering at the fair.

Their experiences at the fair have given the couple many special memories. With her history as a professional singer, Linda loved working with the entertainment, and in particular remembers the first time the fair had an Elvis Impersonator. The grounds and the bleachers were packed, and the crowd loved him...and he sure loved the crowd! There was another year that the fair had a hypnotist on stage, and the audience was treated to a show of their friends and neighbours clucking like chickens! Mark discovered his silly side and was surprised at how much he enjoyed being a clown in a couple of the parades. He also fondly remembers the year that every available flagpole had a Canadian flag hanging from it. He said it just hit him when he walked through the gate, "What a terrific fair this little town has."

Mark and Linda feel they have gained so much from their time volunteering in the community, and in particular with the Comber Fair. Working together with others to organize such a successful, long-standing community event has truly been a source of joy for them. They hope that others will consider reaching out to continue this incredible tradition. They truly believe that it is events like the Comber Fair that make this village such a special place to live.

EXHIBITOR RULES

Exhibitors are required to read the rules carefully and send in their entry forms as soon as possible.

- 1. ****NEW**** The price of admission for adults will be **\$10.00** (includes applicable government taxes) per day, children 12 & under are free. Weekend Fair passes are available for a fee of **\$25.00** (includes applicable government taxes) and allows admittance to the grounds at any time during the fair.
- 2. *The membership fee is \$5.00, which entitles the member to become an exhibitor for anyone 13 yrs and older. *
- 3. The Society will be indemnified and hold harmless and not responsible for accidents on the grounds at any time during the fair.
- 4. Exhibitors winning \$5.00 or over in prize money shall leave \$5.00 with the Society for membership for the following year.
- 5. It is desired that all entries be made on printed forms or online at http://www.assistexpo.ca/entries . If forms are required, please see pages 12 & 13
- 6. Exhibits must be bona fide property of the exhibitor.
- 7. Exhibitors are responsible for their own exhibits but the Society will do everything in its power to ensure their safety and care.
- 8. The judges' decision will be final and any interference will cause a forfeit of the prize money.
- 9. If weather is unfavorable, the Society reserves the right to postpone or cancel the Fair or to pay any percentage of the prize money.
- 10. All entry forms in livestock and poultry must be in the hands of the Treasurer no later than July 28th, 2023. The Society will not be responsible for room if entries are not in on dates specified.
- 11. All entries in roots and vegetables, grain and seeds, baking and home crafts must be submitted by 8:30 p.m. Thursday, August 10th, 2023 and all entry forms must be in the hands of the Treasurer by 8:30 p.m. Thursday, August 10th, 2023.
- 12. All exhibitors must have exhibits on the grounds as follows: Poultry 9:00 am Friday August 11th, 2023; Root and Vegetables 8:30 p.m., Thursday, August 10th, 2023. If exhibitors are late, no prizes will be awarded.
- 13. ALL EXHIBITS CAN NOT BE REMOVED FROM DISPLAY BEFORE 4:00 P.M. ON SUNDAY, AUGUST 13TH, 2023.
- 14. No person will be allowed more than one entry per section per class, except livestock.
- 15. No exhibitor may collect prize money from more than two entries in each livestock section. However, more may be shown to qualify for group entries (livestock).
- 16. No animal may win more than one prize except in Specials and team groups.
- 17. All vendor space(s) rented **MUST** be paid for in advance.
- 18. The Fair Board Office will open in the Lakeshore Community Centre on Thursday, August 10th, 2023, from 1:00 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. to take entry forms. **ABSOLUTLEY NO ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED AFTER 8:30 P.M., NO EXCEPTIONS.**
- 19. All special prizes must be picked up immediately. As far as possible, all special prizes must be in the office on the day of the Fair.
- 20. All exhibitors must be members. Junior membership is free but must also have an exhibitor number to participate.
- 21. An entry fee will be charged for fowl. For further information, see the Poultry Division.
- 22. If an exhibit is not worthy of a prize, according to the Judge, no prize will be awarded.
- 23. Trophies and Special Prizes will be presented at the Fair in the Community Hall after 3:00 p.m. on Sunday, August 13th, 2023.
- 24. NO ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES ALLOWED ON THE GROUNDS AT ANY TIME EXCEPT IN THE BEER GARDEN.
- 25. The driver only of the vehicle bringing in livestock to be exhibited at the fair will be admitted free.
- 26. Poultry, rabbits, ducks, geese and pigeons are not to be removed before 4:00 p.m. on the last day of the fair.
- 27. In case there is a shortage of gate receipts, the directors have decided to pay a percentage of the prize money instead of the full amount.
